A: The formal cadence is every 3 months, and we have cumulative releases every month. However, every release comes with all the cumulative features as part of the version. So, if you haven't caught up with previous releases, you can catch up by installing the most recent version. For instance, if you upgrade to 6.2 you will have all the features we delivered in the last couple of months.
